Later in May, we had a bowling social with the United of Oahu! We hadn't had a social in quite a while, so it was nice to catch up and simply have a good time.




This happens to be my last serendipity, as I'm off to college next year. However, I'm sure the next united president of Honolulu will do a stellar job! I wish you all the best.
